They spoke to our students about the role of a recruitment agency and what kinds of skills and qualities employers are looking for. We discussed what makes a good and bad CV, and tried out some mock interviews - preparing students' responses to some common interview questions.

One of the key elements to successful work experience is flexibility, both in terms of our approach and in enabling a work placement to evolve and change. Thank you to those organisations who continue to work with us flexibly, such as: Sainsbury's who take on a number of students of varying abilities and experience, Waitrose for providing a first taste of work experience to many students, and Ugly Duckling and Timpsons who have supported changes such as new tasks or increased working hours.
