This half term, our lessons have been based around a variety of different themes; small steps to independence, science and Easter to name a few!

Later on in the week, pupil's worked in pairs to follow instructions to make slime! The end results were amazing and exceeded everyone's expectations!

This half term, Pembroke have been learning all about the Easter Story. The class role-played Jesus's arrival in Jerusalem and experienced our interpretation of The Last Supper. They waved green fabric to represent the palm leaves which were waved on Jesus's arrival and placed coats on the floor in front of him. They, again, took part in a class discussion and shared whether they thought Judas was a good friend to Jesus or not. During another lesson, they attended The Last Supper and shared bread and 'wine' (our finest vintage of blackcurrant squash, of course!) whilst listening to and joining in with songs retelling the Easter story.
