What we have been doing this term:

Windsor took part in an exciting story project with Newbury library. We have visited Newbury library, who gave us 5 books to review and complete activities about. We have been reading the books, as sensory stories, and have completed lots of work based on the stories, which is now displayed at Newbury Library, until the start of the Easter holidays, if you . We went back the library to look at our display. The librarian was impressed with the range of ways we explored the books and communicated our preferences. She liked our monster designs.

We joined our link class, Danby, in the woods for world book day. We read "Where's my Teddy, and hunted for teddies in the woodland area, with Charles playing teddy songs, on his accordion. We then put all the teddies to bed, like they do in the story. It was lovely









to join Danby and see everyone interacting with each other, and we hope to see them again soon.

Windsor class have been making patterns with numbers and shapes this term. We have also been practicing our money skills in our snack shop lessons. We have started to explore weight, and have been comparing and ordering heavy and light objects. We have also been working on measuring weight in our cooking lessons, and when making playdough.

In cooking lessons, we have been exploring food from special events. We made pancakes first. Then we learned about Chinese New year and acted out the Chinese new year story. We liked the brightly coloured dragons and sparkly costumes. We made Chinese new year firework fruit kebabs, and sticky marshmallow rice krispie cakes. We have also make Easter nests, and are entering the Easter Bake off.

In PSHE, we have been talking about people who can help us, including doctors and dentists.
