
# The West Berkshire Directory

# Our NEW Disabled Children's Register

The Disabled Children Register (DCR) is a secure database which aims to capture information about all children and young people aged 0-25 years with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND) in West Berkshire. The information that you give us will be used anonymously to show the use of and demand for services in West Berkshire. We will use this information to help us to plan, monitor and develop appropriate facilities and services for disabled children and their families.

The DCR is managed by the West Berkshire Directory. Registering is voluntary but we would like to encourage as many of you as possible to register so that we can get as clear a picture as possible of the needs for services in West Berkshire.

To register you must complete a simple online form https://directory.westberks.gov.uk/kb5/westberkshire/directory/register.page which will allow you to provide us with details of your child. We will be able to use your contact details to keep you up-to-date with developments in services and other relevant information for disabled children and young people.

# West Berkshire SEND Strategy

A brand new strategy for supporting children with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND) across West Berkshire is being published.

'From birth to young adulthood'

The strategy sets out West Berkshire Council's overarching vision and direction for the SEND services over the next five years. Its aim is for West Berkshire to be a place where every child or young person with SEND has a chance to succeed and where no one gets left behind. It sets out a commitment to ensuring that all young people with SEND reach

their full potential and are effectively prepared for their life beyond school, training and further education. The new strategy has five key strands:

- Improving inclusion and education outcomes for children with SEND in Early Years settings and mainstream schools
- 2. Developing more local provision to meet the needs of children with SEND
- Enabling young people with SEND to have good physical and mental health and wellbeing





- 4. Improving Post-16 education, learning, employment and training
- 5. Improving transitions for young people with SEND to enable them to prepare for adulthood

In developing the new strategy, West Berkshire Council worked closely with parents and carers, schools, colleges, health partners and the voluntary and community sectors. Five groups were set up and met earlier this year to jointly identify and agree the priorities to focus on under each of the five themes and the actions to be complete to achieve the objectives.

# About The Careers & Enterprise Company



# Inclusive Football

Thatcham Tornadoes Inclusive Football training sessions are held on the Astro Turf at Henwick Playing Fields, 6.15pm - 7.15pm each Friday and will continue through to March at which point we will move to grass at an alternative venue locally.

Thatcham Tornadoes Inclusive Football has been up and running since early 2017 and over the course of the summer we've had further developments to enhance our offering to children and families locally.



- We are also the first club to be accepted into the Berks and Bucks FA Inclusive program for children aged 4 - 8, more detail on this to follow. This involved the club submitting an action plan, methodology statement and future planning statement as to our commitment to improving opportunities locally for children with physical or neurological challenges.
- We have had a steady increase in numbers in the main 8 12 year old group.
- We've also been specifically allocated 10 hours of coach tutor / mentoring from the Regional Coach Mentor, this will enable us to improve our coaching skillsets and thus improve the sessions for the children.
- More FA funding has been secured which will be used on additional equipment that will aid the players (and will solely be for the use of the inclusive sessions).



Again, this is being provided at no cost to you and as a Community Club we are really trying as hard as possible to drive the message locally that all children, no matter what the circumstances, should have the opportunity to play a sport.

## Happy Days/Coles Diner

I run the clubs voluntary and originally set this up due to my own son having autism, he is growing up and now he no longer attends the younger group. I still carry this on due to being passionate about supporting families similar to my own. This does mean it takes up a lot of my free time with admin and fundraising to keep it going - taking me away from my own family, I am not complaining I am just letting you know the reality behind the scenes. I get no funding for the club, it is not a charity, and it is just myself running it and fundraising keeping it going but I am happy doing this, I enjoy it greatly. I hope this helps you understand the club a little more, so the decision to make it a membership club will help secure fees for the clubs so it gives me a better idea of what I need to fundraise to keep it going.

The membership is £35 for six months so this includes six sessions plus the Christmas Disco for the main child additional siblings are charged £25 for the first one and then £15 for the second, third etc.. Parents are still free. You won't be able to attend the Christmas Disco without membership. You will be able to bring extra family members at an extra cost of £5 per person to attend the disco. If you don't attend all the sessions you will not get refunded - the only time a refund will be issued if I have to cancel the session due to unforeseen circumstances.

Membership will need to be renewed for March 2019 - August 2019 and this will be the same costings as above and includes six sessions plus a Summer day out. You won't be able to attend the summer date without membership but you will be able to bring extra family members at an extra cost of £5 per person to attend the Summer day out once announced - I will offer two dates and you will need to choose one of these to attend.

I have increased the subs to £5 per session this is to help cover costs. I've also made the clubs as a membership only, so this helps me cater more efficiently per session and to reduce waste. I will now have a maximum number to work with. If you don't attend a session money will not be refunded unless I have had to cancel the session or event due to unforeseen circumstances—you will be notified of this in advance.

You will have to become a member to attend the sessions, pay in advance and fill in the membership form for you to attend from September 2018.

### 6 months membership:

Sep 2018 —Feb 2019 including Christmas Disco £35 for the first child / £25 for the sibling / £15 each for extra siblings. Parents are still free but will need to be included on the membership form please.

This means that the Christmas Disco and the Summer Event will be incorporated in the memberships costs.

## **Our Story**

I set up the club in January 2012 as a voluntary club helping families like ours. I am autistic myself and have two children one who is also on the spectrum. I work for a secondary school and have run a successful youth club since 2001 for young deaf teenagers who help volunteer along with myself at Happy Days /HD Gamers Den. I rely on fundraising to maintain Happy Days and I organise all this in my free time along side a full time job and family.

Happy Days was born in the hope to help others and to provide a space once a month for children and young people across West Berkshire. The club is for children and young people on the autistic spectrum, deafness, ADHD and their families (siblings and parents) we all understand the difficulties and can support each other. It means we can be ourselves in a space to call our own. We don't judge and we don't hide away from the fact that they we are all living with hidden disabilities.

#### There are two groups:

- Happy Days—a club with toys, crafts and a movie for children with ASC, Deafness or and ADHD aged 5-10 years old on a Monday once a month 4.30-6.30 pm
- HD Gamers Den—a club with computer consoles and board games for young people with ASC, Deafness or and ADHD aged 11-18 years old on a Tuesday once a month 6.30-8.30 pm


