

The 14-19 Curriculum

Vision: Our 14-19 curriculum aims to provide students with the academic and functional life skills needed as individuals to support them in their adult lives.

Intent: The 14-19 curriculum is designed to provide students with challenge to ensure they can be as independent as they can be. The three pathways provide structure with flexibility to allow students to progress appropriately in all areas of their life now, and moving in to adulthood.

Drivers: Communication, Curiosity, Creativity and Community

We pride ourselves on developing a bespoke study programme for each student as they move through which comes under three pathways. As the students develop, their pathway is not always set in stone and our approach provides us with the flexibility needed to adapt as the student grows and develops in their preparation for adulthood journey.

Towards Further Education and Skills for Life

Students working along this pathway are likely to need a high level of support throughout their life. They will be working to become as independent as they can, whether that be developing understanding of cause and effect, linking to switch work and then transferring to everyday electrical items, to developing communication through their preferred method in the community.

Towards Further Education, Employment

Students working along this pathway are likely to need an element of support in adulthood. They may have the skills to live reasonably independently but need a low level of support in some areas. They may be working towards employment but this may not be a traditional '9-5'. Students may move on to college to continue to develop their independent living and employment skills.

Towards Employment

Students working along this pathway are likely to move in to employment and be able to live independently. They may need to move on to Further Education to gain specific qualifications linked to their career aspirations. Alternatively, they may move in to employment through a Supported Internship, Supported Apprenticeship or through our World of Work Program.
