



The Voyage Curriculum Pathway

The Voyage Curriculum is designed to provide challenging, stimulating and relevant learning opportunities based around diverse themes each term. Students will have the opportunity to learn and progress, following the Primary National Curriculum framework for Maths, English, Science, History, Geography, Computing, Art, Design and Technology, RE and PE. We believe that it is vital that all students experience the breadth and depth of learning opportunities, with appropriately differentiated input and outcomes. The English and Maths curriculum is carefully designed to progress from early years to Functional Skills curriculum.

Students are encouraged to think on a deeper level to understand similarities and differences between the past and present day and between different places. Teaching encourages enthusiasm and enjoyment from all students by developing their contextual knowledge of globally significant places and how we all have a place and an impact upon local, national and international communities.

A wide variety of lessons prepare students for the wider world by allowing them to explore a range of practical tasks, using problem solving and skills learnt in the other subjects.

Creativity is embraced within all subjects and it is recognised that Art provides with opportunities to develop a range of ways in which they can share and express their individual creativity, whilst learning about and making links with a wide spectrum of different types of art in our society. Art contributes to children's personal development in creativity, independence, judgement and self-reflection. Moreover, it enables pupils to develop a natural sense of wonder and curiosity about the world around them and therefore links strongly to our school values.
