In Cooking we have practised using different ways of measuring ingredients and reading scales; weighing on electric and non-electric, using cups, tablespoons and measuring jugs.

In English we discussed and explored various jobs and the clothes and equipment linked to them. We have looked at menu writing, layout and pricing. Our topic book has been 'The True Story of the Three Little Pigs', which they have really enjoyed and linked to our construction week.

In Topic and Messy Play we have been learning about the season of winter, arctic animals, hibernation and discovering properties of ice and melting.
