What we have been learning this term:

This term we have continued to explore our topic of 'What's on your plate?'

In English we have explored the difference between fiction and non-fiction texts, before focusing on recipe books. We identified the different parts in a recipe before writing instructions to make toast and writing lists for the ingredients to make slime!

For World Book Day we all enjoyed dressing up as characters from different books. In class we focused on 'Kitchen Disco', dressing up as different foods and enjoyed a Bucket session. We also took a trip into town to choose and purchase a book before enjoying some time at Victoria Park!

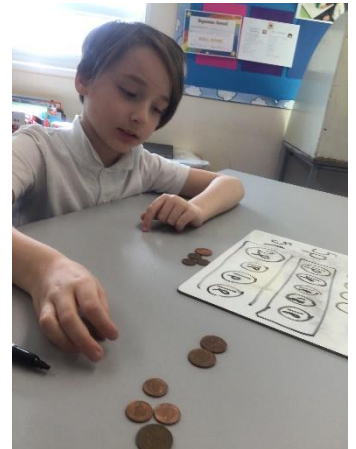
In Maths we have focused on money, recognising and identifying coins, using dienes to correspond coins to their worth and adding coins to make different amounts. We have also really enjoyed role playing in the class shop to buy different items.

In science we have explored our bodies, we drew around ourselves and labelled different body parts and have begun to discuss body parts which are private. We are also exploring our senses – in our sight lesson we moved around an obstacle course which was so easy! We then tried to do it again with a blindfold on which was much harder and made us think about how important it is that we can see.

In our weekly horse riding sessions, Skipton Class have continued to work towards their Grade 1 certificate and have begun horse care sessions, learning how to brush and care for the horses as well as tacking up the horses and removing the tack at the end of the session. Everyone has really enjoyed this aspect of caring for the horses.
