

You may need an assessment from one of our Children or Adult Social Care teams to access some of the services. This is also an excellent resource for many professionals.

The wide range of information available includes local and national services. From ante natal clinic to toddler groups, schools and colleges, clubs, debt advice and care homes and day centres.

Initially it is divided into 3 areas

- · Adults Adult Social Care
- · Families Family Information Service
- SEND Local Offer

There are almost 2000 records in this directory and is being continually updated, we rely on the updating being carried out by the contributors but we are constantly monitoring and checking the records.

West Berkshire SENDIASS

(Information, Advice and Support Service)

Local Authorities have a statutory duty to provide information, advice and support for disabled children and young people, and those with SEN, and their parents.

In West Berkshire this is provided by the Rose Road Association, and called SENDIASS. This is a free, impartial and confidential service. Some of you will know this as Parent Partnership prior to the reforms in 2014. Their role is not only to advise parents but to empower them to understand the legal responsibilities of schools and the local authority.

There are two SENDIASS advisors in West Berkshire who can support parents and carers on the phone, email or even attend meetings with them. They are Jen Jones and Maxine Jewitt. The Manager is Jo Maxwell-Heron (0788 134 0136) If you would like an advisor to attend an event/coffee morning, SENDIASS would be glad to. They will talk to parents about SEN Support (for those pupils without EHCPs), how to apply for an EHCP or preparation for an Annual Review. As a parent you can contact SENDIASS directly.

Better Together

It's really important that families who have children with disabilities and special needs are able to access support and services that are appropriate for them within their community. A group of local charities identified the need for more joined up working and established a forum who meet regularly throughout the year to offer both joint events and to avoid duplication of services. Through this forum opportunities for joint training and sharing good practice is also explored and a chance for the staff to network.

During school holidays a number of charities get together and offer a fun event for families, this summer Swings & Smiles, PALS, West Berkshire Mencap and Dingley's Promise are offering two joint events – the first to be held at Mencap on Friday 26th July and another at Swings & Smiles on Tuesday 20th August – both to be held between 10-2pm - £5 per family and no need to book.

Through the forum there has also been many opportunities for collaboration and sharing premises – currently the Watermill Theatre use Swings & Smiles to deliver a drama group and an exciting Story Adventures project running this summer, Autism Berkshire also bring their expertise along to coffee mornings already

running at the centre. Other joint events and information sharing also happens throughout the year as well as an annual list of activities taking place throughout the summer holidays being produced so families can see at a glance what's going on.

Relationships built via the forum also meant that when there was an opportunity to help continue the running of the Spectrum and Oasis youth clubs Swings & Smiles were able to take the project on. With the National Autistic Society, West Berkshire Branch continuing to fund these clubs for 2 years support for children and young people with Autism will be able to still take place, running from Speenhamland School on Thursday evenings.

Laura Lewis, Director of Swings & Smiles and chair of the SEND provider forum says, "working together in this way has been hugely beneficial to all of us charities but most importantly to the families that need our support, sharing resources and knowledge means that we can offer more to more."

We held our annual Careers Week where students from Key Stage 4 and 6th form participated in various activities, including visits to local employers, workshops and assemblies - the students also had a practice interview for their chosen job.

We run a **Schools Prize Draw** every year for state primary and secondary schools to win £500 for a project of their choice. Each school who registers 10 or more pupils to run in **Step Up 4 Good 2019**, will automatically be entered into the draw. (The school must be within Greenham Trust's area of operation – see T&C's on the website) The prize is drawn and announced a few days after the event.

Also, this year we will be launching our first ever unique **Para-Mile**. This is aimed at children

under 15 with a disability or impairment and it is completely free to enter, thanks to the kind sponsor -Swift Group. The children will receive a bib number and chip timing, as we want to ensure an all-inclusive feel to our first race. Children can run, jog or walk alone or with a parent or carer, whatever they prefer. Every Para-Mile runner (and paid entrant) will all receive a tech t-shirt, personalised bib and finishers medal. There will be no winner as such for the para-mile and no trophy, as it is very difficult to categorise the various disabilities taking part.

On race day, located within the Grandstand building, will be 20 charity stalls helping us to bring a vibrant community buzz to a very large space. If this is of interest to you, please get in touch. A 6ft trestle table and two chairs will be provided, so it's just a case of turning up early and promoting your charity and project for a few hours to runners and supporters.

Due to the move from Greenham Common to Newbury Racecourse, we want to make this Newbury's #1 family running event in the race calendar and grow the numbers significantly. With your help we can reach more children to sign up for our bigger and better race this year.

Summer Reading Challenge

All 4-11yr olds are invited to take part in the Summer Reading Challenge run by West Berkshire Libraries, which runs from 1 July until 30 September. It's FREE to join in and great fun, as well as helping children develop confidence and maintain their reading skills over the summer holidays.

This year's challenge is called Space Chase and is all about the futuristic Rocket family, who are on a mission to track down some aliens who have stolen books from Moon Library. When they sign up for the challenge, children are given a colourful 'mission folder', and as they borrow and read library books they receive stickers for their folder which provide clues for the mission. The aim is to read 6 books by the end of September. After they've read 2 books, children get a special Space Chase paper game; after 4 books they get an alien 'window clinger'; and there are certificates and golden medals for all who complete the challenge.

Younger children who are good readers are welcome to take part too. But there's also a Mini Challenge for non-readers - and one for adults as well! (You just need to read any 3 library books by end of Sept, fiction or non fiction, including audiobooks and e-books. Everyone who completes the challenge will be entered into a prize draw to win a wifi tablet.)



Children need to have their own library cards to join the challenge. It's free to join the library and of course it's free to borrow books too.
